## SHAKESPEAREAN TRAGEDY: SOLILOQUY/ASIDE

A **soliloquy** is a long speech that a character makes while alone on stage or when no one on stage is supposed to be listening. An **aside** is a remark that a character says to the audience or another character but that everyone else on stage is not supposed to hear. Shakespeare uses both devices to reveal characters' thoughts to the audience.
